

Sign Up for a Free E-Newsletter from MassWildlife

Attention anglers, hunters and trappers—would you like to receive the latest updates in regulations, state land acquisitions and other useful wildlife information from the Mass. Division of Fisheries and Wildlife (MassWildlife)? For years, MassWildlife has published a four page newsletter that went out by postal mail to a limited audience such as sportsmens clubs, media, town clerks and conservation commissions. The agency couldn't afford the printing and postage to send it out to thousands of people. Now, in the age of the computer, individuals may obtain MassWildlife's monthly newsletter, the MassWildlife News, for by signing up electronically! Currently, the MassWildlife News goes out to nearly 5,000 email addresses!

What Is in the Newsletter?--Any conservation minded group or individual will find something of interest or value in this free newsletter—habitat improvement grants for private landowners, outdoor safety tips, seasonal reminders, preliminary harvest figures, fish stocking information and a calendar of wildlife events are among some of the items in the newsletter. Subscribers are sent the newsletter by email once or twice per month. Occasionally, a special advisory may also come to your email box announcing new regulations (such as the new coyote regulations) or an invitation to a land acquisition celebration. Rest assured you will NOT be spammed by the agency! To view newsletters from the past year, go the www.mass.gov/masswildlife and in the Seasonal Highlights box, click on the Newsletter issue.

How Do I Sign Up?--To subscribe send an email to: Join-MassWildlife.news@listserv.state.ma.us. A confirmation message will follow with a short survey (30 seconds) asking about your wildlife-related interests and affiliations. Tell your friends and family members about this free service.

Lastly, if you or a friend has a wildlife related question that you just can't figure out, contact MassWildlife by email at mass.wildlife@state.ma.us . If you don't stump the staff with an unusual question, you generally will get a response within 1-2 business days. If we don't know the answer, we can generally guide you to someone or place that can assist you!
